Happy Retirement

The Medicare Savings Program (MSP), can assist people with limited income in paying their Medicare premiums. If your gross monthly income is under \$2,355 for an individual or \$3,189 for a couple, you may qualify for this benefit. There is no resource limit for MSP. If your income is slightly higher than this, you may still qualify if you are paying for a health insurance premium. Recipes

Authentic German Potato Salad

4 pounds red potatoes, diced

1 pound sliced bacon, diced

1 small onion, diced

1/2 cup white vinegar

1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon pepper

Step 1:

Place the potatoes in a pot, with enough water to cover. Bring to a boil and cook for about 10 minutes, or until easily pierced with a fork.

Drain, set aside to cool in a large dutch oven/ baking dish.

Step 2:

Place the diced bacon in a large deep skillet over medium-high heat and set aside, grease and all!! (do not drain the bacon, you will use the bacon grease!)

Step 3:

Place small chopped onion in a frying pan with some of the bacon grease, and cook over medium high heat until browned.

Step 4:

Add the vinegar, salt, pepper, and onion to the pan of diced potatoes. Then add all the bacon and grease and stir well to combine. Serve warm and enjoy!
